- 6. For each of the following common anticancer therapies, identify a potentially serious DDI and formulate an appropriate strategy to manage the patient's risk:

Tyrosine kinase inhibitor (e.g. erlotinib) Aromatase Inhibitor (e.g. letrozole) Alkylating agent (e.g. cyclophosphamide) Vinca Alkaloid (e.g. vincristine)
