Statement of Goal: To review select topics in contemporary medical care, infection prevention and oncologic drug interactions in HIV/AIDS clients.

4. Identify and discuss three important therapeutic observations about the management of HIV infection in patients with cancer receiving chemotherapy.
5. Identify two well-documented mechanisms of drug-drug interactions between ART and anticancer treatment
6. For each of the following common anticancer therapies, identify a potentially serious DDI and formulate an appropriate strategy to manage the patient's risk:
 - Tyrosine kinase inhibitor (e.g. erlotinib)
 - Aromatase Inhibitor (e.g. letrozole)
 - Alkylating agent (e.g. cyclophosphamide)
 - Vinca Alkaloid (e.g. vincristine)
