Needs statement: There has been a national increase of Gram-negative bacterial infections caused by pathogens such as Carbapenem-resistant Enterobacteriaceae (CRE), Acinetobacter baumannii, Extended-spectrum B-lactamase (ESBL)-producing Enterobacteriaceae, and Multidrug-resistant Pseudomonas aeruginosa. These organisms cause some of the most serious infections and are increasingly resistant to multiple drugs.
